WELLS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL REQUESTING COMMUNITY SUPPORT

The Wells Elementary School (WES) has implemented the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) model as a new initiative. This approach has required establishing clear expectations across the school environment, teaching students the necessary skills required for positive school-wide behavior, and reinforcing the children through a variety of ways when they achieve success.

Several businesses have partnered with us already to support this initiative, which has significantly reduced overall disciplinary referrals at school and on the busses. We would love to identify if any other local businesses would be able to offer any support to our students through either donations, or time. We have begun to provide our students the opportunity to shop in a school store on a monthly basis. Teachers have also established a number of reinforcement ideas with their classrooms that children can earn for positive behavior (i.e. flashlight Friday, extra recess, earning a movie and popcorn, etc.). There is a Student Council meeting regularly, to discuss and determine other reinforcing initiatives of which the entire school can work toward. We would love to request any donation involving gift certificates for meals, products from your business that would be appropriate for children, tickets to shows/movies, etc. from local businesses that we could utilize as incentives. We would like to hear any additional ideas you may have, and if you might be willing to support this initiative in some way. We are already seeing a substantial difference in student behavior and overall school culture.
